The purpose of the plan is to construct multifamily residential units (a 3-story 24-unit apartment building) in Apartment-Office Zone. Outstanding zoning items are parking, dumpster location and front yard requirements, and fence height. This is the third time extension requested. Planning Commission tabled the plan at the Jan. 2024 meeting due to outstanding items; a new plan has not been submitted to-date.
