SPRING GARDEN TOWNSHIP GRANTED FUNDING FOR STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS

SPRING GARDEN TOWNSHIP, York County – Spring Garden Township received \$320,000 in grant funding from the Pennsylvania Small Water and Sewer Program on Tuesday to support critical improvements to the Township’s stormwater management system.

“This investment ensures the long-term sustainability of our stormwater system and protects residents from flooding and environmental hazards. We are deeply grateful to Senator Kristin Phillips-Hill and Representative Carol Hill-Evans for their support in securing this funding for our community,” said David Detwiler, President Commissioner of the Spring Garden Township Board of Commissioners.

The funding will be used to rehabilitate a deteriorating segment of the municipal stormwater pipeline along Brookway Drive where the 35-year-old corrugated metal pipe has suffered joint separation, corrosion, sediment buildup, and diminished drainage capacity. Restoring the pipeline’s integrity will extend its service life, mitigate risk of flooding and soil erosion, and prevent costly future failures.

“I am proud to support Spring Garden Township in securing this critical funding to improve aging infrastructure. These upgrades will help protect homes, businesses, and the environment while ensuring the community’s stormwater system remains reliable for years to come,” said Senator Kristin Phillips-Hill.

Administered by the Commonwealth Financing Authority, PASWS provides grants to municipalities and municipal authorities across the state for projects related to water supply, wastewater, flood prevention, and stormwater.

“Investing in local infrastructure is essential to maintaining public safety and quality of life. I am pleased to see these funds go toward a project that addresses long-standing concerns and benefits residents throughout the Township,” said Representative Carol Hill-Evans.

PASWS announced more than \$110 million in funding to support 445 projects across the state.
