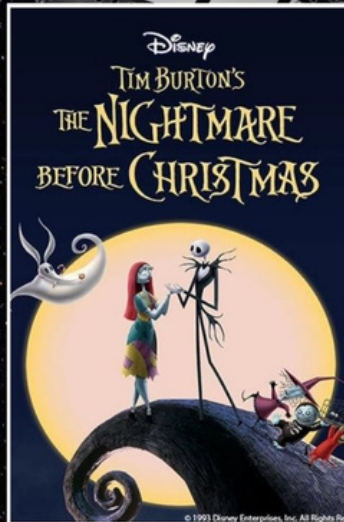

Leaves and Stormwater

It's that time of year when the leaves start falling, but it's important to keep them out of the storm drains. Falling leaves can block storm drains in neighborhoods, resulting in excess stormwater and flooding conditions. Proper disposal of leaves and yard waste keeps waterways clean and helps maintain water quality.

When raking your leaves, be sure to follow these tips to keep storm drains clear this fall:

- Never rake or blow leaves or grass clippings into the streets, ditches or storm drains.
- If putting leaves to the curb for collection, only place leaves at the curbside on the designated day of pickup.
- Mow over leaves to create a finely chopped mulch to be used in your garden.
- Put fallen leaves and other organic debris into a compost bin.

If you see a storm drain in your neighborhood that is blocked by leaves or debris, please clear the storm drain with a rake or shovel, providing it is safe to do so, and dispose of them properly.

Ward 3 On-Lot Sewage Tank Pumping or Cesspool Inspections Due

Ordinance §250-126 requires that every three years owners must have their on-lot system inspected and pumped by a qualified pumper/hauler. Cesspools require an inspection by the Township Sewage Enforcement Officer. The pumping or inspection must be completed by July 31, 2027. **If your inspection shows you require repairs to your system, you must contact the Township Sewage Enforcement Officer for review and permitting.** Are you having your system maintained more frequently? Please contact us so that we can update our records. For more information or before completing any work on your system contact the Township office.



Fire Pits

As the weather turns cooler, backyard fire pits become very inviting. When having a controlled fire take note that Ordinance §260-18.A(7) prohibits burning of garbage and recyclable materials including cardboard, leaf waste, and brush. Ordinance §145-13 provides safety guidance for storage of firewood. When installing a fire pit, check with the fire department for guidance to make sure you have proper overhead clearances and are a safe distance from any structures. Enjoy your fire safely!

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Fall is around the corner and can be a busy time prepping your home and property for the upcoming cold winter months. Please keep the following at the top of your to do list this fall.

Ordinance 290-1 Responsibility for trimming trees; clearance over public ways; utility company rights: It shall be the duty of the owner or owners of every property located in the Township of Spring Garden, York County, Pennsylvania, to trim or cut and keep trimmed or cut the trees standing along the street abutting the front, side or rear of said such property so that branches thereof shall have a clearance of at least 14 feet above the cartway or paved area of the street along said property and shall have a clearance of at least seven feet above the sidewalk area.

Ordinance 290-2 Encroachment prohibited: It shall also be the duty of the owner or owners of every property located in the Township to trim or remove all trees, shrubbery or hedges, or other growing things extending beyond the property line.

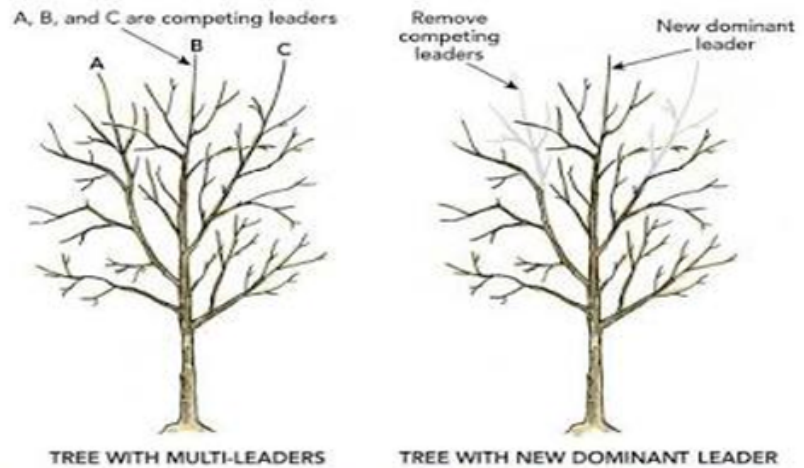
Best Time to Start Pruning for Fall in Pennsylvania

For most trees and shrubs in Pennsylvania, late summer to early fall (August–October) is the last safe window for general pruning before winter, but timing depends heavily on the species and your pruning goals.

General fall pruning window:

Late August to early October is often used for structural and corrective pruning of deciduous trees and shrubs. This allows the plant to heal before winter cold sets in, especially if you're removing dead, damaged, or hazardous branches (cultivatingflora.com)

Avoid heavy pruning in late summer/early fall for species that bloom on new wood, as new growth can be vulnerable to winter injury.



Species-specific timing for fall pruning:

Deciduous trees (oaks, maples, birches):

Prune in late August–early October for structural work or hazard removal. Avoid heavy cuts if you want to preserve next year's flowering (cultivatingflora.com).

Evergreens: Light pruning in fall is fine, but avoid heavy cuts that stimulate new growth before winter. (www.clausertreecare.com)



Spring-flowering shrubs (forsythia, lilac, azalea): These should be pruned immediately after bloom (late April–early June), not in fall. (cultivatingflora.com).

Summer-flowering shrubs (hydrangeas, roses): Prune in late winter/early spring, not in fall. (cultivatingflora.com).

Why You Shouldn't Let Yard Waste Rot in Your Yard

Letting yard waste rot in your yard can seem harmless, but it can cause environmental, health, and property problems if not managed properly.

- **Environmental impact:** When organic materials like leaves, grass clippings, and branches decompose without oxygen (anaerobically) in piles, they produce methane (CH₄), a greenhouse gas about 25–34 times more potent than carbon dioxide over a century (redoaksanitation.com).
- **Smothering grass:** Thick, wet layers of leaves or large clumps of grass block sunlight and air circulation, killing the living grass underneath.
- **Attracting pests:** Piles of damp organic debris create ideal breeding and hiding grounds for ticks, fleas, and rodents close to your home.
- **Spreading fungal diseases:** Trapped moisture in un-shredded or matted piles promotes lawn fungus, root rot, and gray snow mold.
- **Creating an eyesore:** Piles left to sit uncontained make a property look unkempt and can permanently stain concrete patios, walkways, or driveways.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Fall is the perfect time to prepare your property for the colder months while preventing costly winter damage.

1. Exterior & Structural Checks

- Inspect the roof for damaged or missing shingles; repair before snow and ice arrive.
- Clean gutters and downspouts to prevent ice dams and water damage.
- Seal gaps and cracks in siding, windows, and doors to improve insulation.
- Check foundation for cracks or signs of water intrusion.

2. HVAC & Heating Systems

- Service the furnace or boiler; replace filters and test for efficiency.
- Inspect chimneys and fireplaces for blockages or creosote buildup.
- Test carbon monoxide detectors and replace batteries.

3. Plumbing & Water Systems

- Drain and shut off outdoor faucets; store hoses indoors.
- Insulate exposed pipes to prevent freezing.
- Check sump pump operation before heavy rains.

4. Safety & Lighting

- Replace exterior light bulbs for shorter daylight hours.
- Trim trees and shrubs away from buildings and power lines.
- Clear walkways of debris to prevent slips.

ALL property sales (including refinances, deed transfers, vacant land, and on-lot systems) require a sewer certification request be submitted to the Township at least 5 business days before settlement. This guarantees that all sewer payments have been paid, and sewer billing will be sent to the correct party. The fee of \$35.00 must be submitted with the completed form for the Township to process the request.

A 10% late fee will be assessed on any unpaid balance 15 days after the due date

If you encounter our work zones, please keep the following tips in mind for your safety and the safety of highway workers:

Street Cleaning & Leaf Collection

If your street does not have parking restrictions listed - street cleaning and leaf collection will occur on the first or fourth week of the month.

Residents are encouraged to recycle their leaf waste in the Fall by placing them at the edge of the curb **within their yard** in a neat row or pile **Please do NOT place them in the street or traffic lanes**; this is a violation of the Stormwater Management ordinance. This will allow safe passage of vehicles and allow proper stormwater drainage.

Brush Drop Off

1799 Mount Rose Avenue - - 8am—Noon

Tree limbs are limited to 8 inches in diameter or less and cannot exceed 8 feet in length. Residents are asked to unload brush from their own vehicles and limit the number of drop offs to 2 truck or trailer loads.

LANDLORD-TENANT CASES – PART TWO

At the Recovery of Real Property Hearing, the landlord has the burden of proof of establishing the actual amount of monetary damages the Magisterial District Judge should consider. A spreadsheet should be submitted by the landlord as evidence. A tenant should be prepared to produce receipts for monies paid. Possession of a property may be awarded if the Judge determines that the tenant has breached the terms of the existing lease or is a holdover following expiration of the term of the lease. The most common reason for possession being awarded to a landlord is the tenant's failure to pay timely rent.

Unless the case is continued for good cause, a judgment will be rendered at the conclusion of the Hearing. The judgment usually includes an amount for monetary damages and filing fees. Attorney fees can be awarded only if authorized under the terms of the lease and deemed reasonable by the Court. The judgment may allow the tenant to stay at the property if monetary damages are paid in full by the time the appeal period runs ("pay and stay"). Where possession is granted outright or in the case of a "pay and stay" where the tenant has not fully paid, the landlord can come to District Court 19-2-05 and pay a fee for an Order of Possession. The landlord can lock the tenant(s) out.

A party may appeal the decision of the Judge to the Court of Common Pleas. Usually, the appeal period is 10 days; this period extends to 30 days in residential actions for tenants who are victims of domestic violence. Please be reminded that those seeking to rent a residential property within Spring Garden Township must apply to the Township to do so.

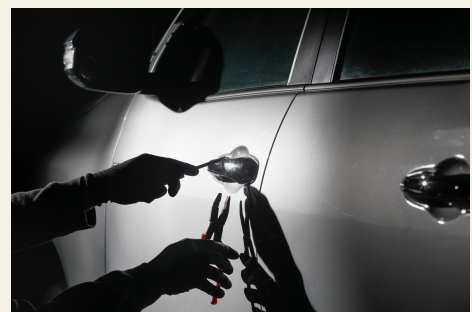


"Paul Miller's Law"

Went into effect as a summary citable offense in PA State law on June 6, 2026.



- Prohibits the use of hand-held devices while driving
- Prohibits any text-based communications even while temporarily stopped in traffic
- Permitted to use HANDS-FREE TECHNOLOGY ONLY to make calls, GPS and listen to music



VEHICLE BREAK-INS: A car thief can break into your car and be out in about 30 seconds, fast enough that an alarm doesn't scare most of them away. Here are some precautions to take to prevent you from being a victim:

- Roll up your windows and **LOCK YOUR VEHICLE DOORS.**
- Keep your vehicle tidy and conceal all electronics, accessories, money and valuables.
- Park in a well-lit area.

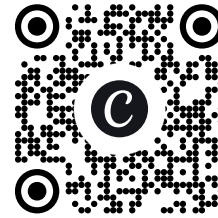

HELP KEEP TOWNSHIP STREETS CLEAN

All trash should be placed in bags, in the toter, with the lid closed. All recycling should be placed in the toter with the lid closed. This helps to prevent debris from falling into the streets in inclement weather or during collection.

How to Prepare Yard Waste

Place yard waste in biodegradable brown paper bags or bundle it with biodegradable twine in easy-to-handle bundles: Bundles may be no longer than 5 feet in length.

Bundles may not weigh more than 30 pounds each.

Bundles may not exceed 6 inches in diameter.

Once prepared, yard waste must be placed at the curb on the scheduled pickup day before 6:30 am.

An unlimited number of bags or bundles may be placed at the curb.

Please prepare your yard waste properly. Yard Waste in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected!

DO NOT place these items out for yard waste collection: Grass clippings, fruits & vegetables, tree stumps, and dirt & stones.

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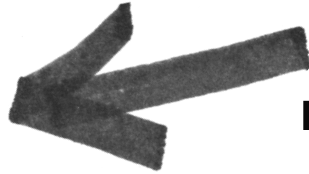
