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PLANNING & ZONING

Think before you wash! Thinking about washing your car at home to save a few dollars and give it that great hand wash? Before you grab that bucket and sponge, let's chat. Today, the "greenest" way to wash your car is to take it to an automatic car wash. The main reasons for this are that hand washing uses excessive amounts of water and when washing and rinsing your car it releases harmful substances such as soap residue, oil, acid, and metal particles into the storm sewer system. Regulations are also in place that require commercial carwash systems to contain and collect the dirty water used during a wash cycle. This wastewater is then cleaned, and in many cases reused, preventing toxins from entering the local streams and waterways.

If you do plan to wash your car at home, follow these steps to make it more environmentally friendly:

- i. Buy automotive soap and cleaners that are biodegradable and non-toxic.
- ii. Wash your car on grass or gravel that will absorb the water into the ground to reduce or eliminate runoff into streams and waterways.

Washing cars with toxic cleaners and allowing the water to flow into the street is considered an illicit discharge under Section 265 of Spring Garden Township's Stormwater Management Ordinance and can result in violations and fines. Please be kind to the environment and either use a commercial car wash or non-toxic cleaners.



Have questions about a project on your property?

The Spring Garden Township Zoning Ordinance can provide guidance to residents looking to improve their properties or change uses on the property. Information on permit requirements, sign regulations, driveways, parking requirements, setbacks, accessory structures including sheds and fences, and information on swimming pools and backyard hardscapes can all be found in our Zoning Ordinance.

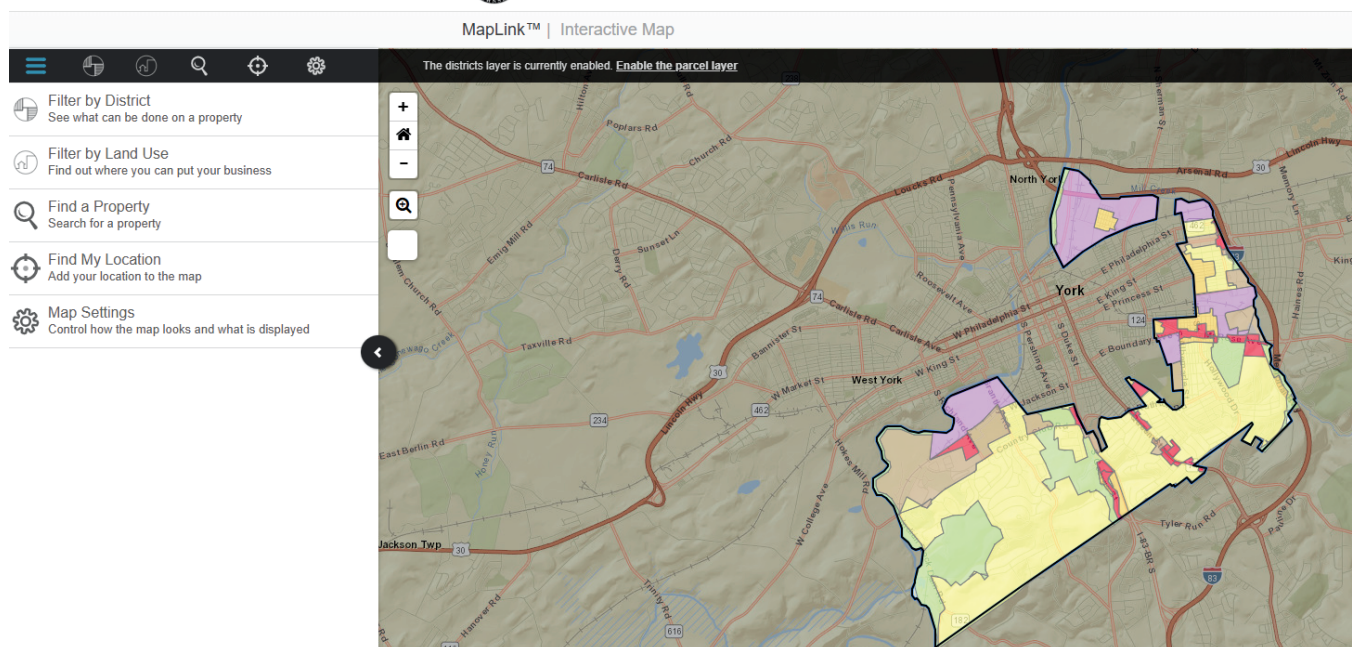

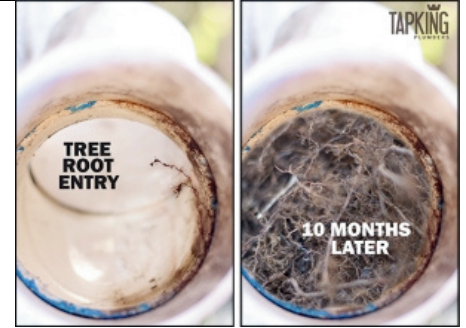

PUBLIC WORKS

Sewer Root Control

The continual flow of nutrient-filled water found in sewer pipes attracts tree roots. Roots growing along pipes exert significant pressure on pipes. These roots may push into and around gasket connection points which may expand and break seals. Root infiltration can cause a blockage to the service resulting in sewage backup in your home and damage to your property. Temporary solutions include a plumber using an auger to cut tree roots and pouring/flushing root control product to dissolve the roots. The only permanent solution is to remove the tree and repair the section of sewer pipe that has been damaged from the roots.



Sewer Backup Preventions

Sanitary sewer line blockages are typically caused by roots, grease, and improper disposal of items. Tree roots can enter the sanitary sewer system at joints and cracks in the sewer service lines and mains. Remember, the very same things can help prevent backups in the Township sewer main as well.

Grease

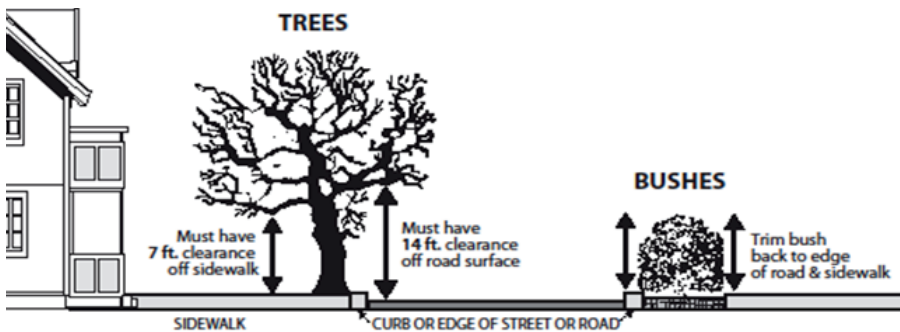
Cooking oil should be poured into a heat-resistant container and disposed of in the garbage after it cools, not down the drain. Some people assume washing grease down the drain with hot water is satisfactory. Grease down the drain, cools off and solidifies either in the drain, the property owner's service, or in the sewer main. When this happens the line eventually clogs.

Paper Products

"Flushable" wipes, paper towels, disposable diapers, and cat litter cause many problems in the property owner's service and the township's main. They become lodged in portions of the service and main, causing sewer backups. These products should be disposed of in the garbage.

Maintenance of Grass, Weeds, Trees, Bushes, and Roadside Vegetation

- The Township receives many complaints each year about properties where the grass, weeds, and bushes are overgrown. The ordinance states, all premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growth more than 6 inches. This includes any flowerbeds. Please keep the grass cut and the weeds pulled to avoid a violation letter from the township.
- Trees, bushes, and shrubs must have a clearance of 14 feet from the road surface and 7 feet clearance from the public sidewalk.
- Trees, bushes, and shrubs may not extend beyond the property line into any public street, public alley, or public sidewalk.
- At all intersections of streets, private roads and/or access drives, a clear sight triangle shall be maintained so not to cause a visual obstruction from trees, hedges, shrubs, or other vegetation which cannot be more than 3 feet above the road surface.

Street Sweeping

Residents are reminded to check the posted signs in their neighborhood for the street cleaning schedule. Residents are encouraged to move their vehicle to avoid being ticketed. The same schedule is also used in the Fall for leaf collection which will extend until December.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Let's talk trash! Next to overgrown grass and vegetation, this is the 2nd biggest complaint we receive. Scattered trash and debris on your property is not just your problem. It gets carried to other properties by wind and or animals, it gets in the stormwater system, and it invites unwanted critters. In the hot summer months food trash can get maggots within 7 hours. **PLEASE BE DILIGENT** in making sure none of these issues begin with you. If your trash is not 100% secure in your garbage bins you can be sure when Penn Waste collects it there will be some runaways. Runaway trash should be picked up and disposed of right away. Additionally, adhering to the below ordinance will greatly reduce the likelihood of unwanted scattered trash. Article I § 260-1 C. (5) and (6) of SGTWP Ordinances states:

(5) Filled containers shall not be placed on the curb side of the sidewalk or in the rear alley (wherever the garbage is scheduled for collection) earlier than 6:00 p.m. on the evening preceding the day scheduled for collection.

(6) Empty containers must be removed from sidewalks and alleys within 12 hours from the time the collection is made, if collection is made on the scheduled day.



We can't stop with our trash bins. Outdoor storage and stock piling of junk and garbage is a property maintenance ordinance violation defined in ordinance §165-2 as Nuisances declared illegal.

Outdoor storage areas frequently serve as primary, yet preventable, harborage (living, nesting, or breeding places) for vectors such as rats, mice, mosquitoes, and flies. Proper management is essential to prevent these areas from creating health and safety issues.

Common Sources of Harborage:

Dilapidated Items & Equipment: Abandoned machinery, auto parts, or contractor equipment.

Waste Materials: Accumulated junk, rubbish, or refuse that provides shelter.

Tires: Uncovered tires are a prime source for standing water and mosquito breeding.

Firewood Stacks: Piles close to the ground provide hiding spots.

Construction Debris & Materials: Loose materials (fittings, joints), canvas sheets, and water-filled barricades.

Vegetation: High grass and weeds or dense neglected vegetation.



CODE ENFORCEMENT

Keeping your property free from trash, debris, outdoor storage, and stock piling of junk and garbage is not only at the least an **esthetic property maintenance issue**, at worst a **health and safety issue**, it is also an issue that can **hit you in your bottom line**.



Real estate agents emphasize that **trash, junk, or excessive clutter** in and around a seller's home, as well as the surrounding neighborhood, can significantly negatively impact a property's asking price. Nearly every survey respondent agreed that trash, junk, or excessive clutter decreases a home's market value. The impact can vary, with some agents estimating a decrease of 5% to 10%, while others believe it could be as high as 30% to 50%. The presence of items like trash, clutter, and yard waste can create negative assumptions about the home's maintenance and value, leading to a decrease in property value.

ALL property sales (including refinances, deed transfers, vacant land, and on-lot systems) require a sewer certification request be submitted to the Township at least 5 business days before settlement. This guarantees that all sewer payments have been paid, and sewer billing will be sent to the correct party. The fee of \$35.00 must be submitted with the completed form for the Township to process the request.

A 10% late fee will be assessed on any unpaid balance 15 days after the due date

LANDLORD-TENANT CASES – PART ONE

A landlord owning a residential or non-residential property within Spring Garden Township can file a Landlord-Tenant Complaint at District Court 19-2-05, if necessary, to recover monetary damages and/or possession of a property. This Court only has jurisdiction of such a filing where there is a lease. If there is no lease the Complaint will be dismissed at the outset of a Recovery of Real Property Hearing.

The filing can be done by the landlord or an authorized representative. Your Judge requires that a copy of a written lease accompany the filing. If an oral lease is alleged, it will have to be proven at the outset of the Hearing. A fee must be paid to District Court 19-2-05 at the time of filing; the fee is determined by the amount of monetary damages being sought, the number of tenants being named in the Complaint and the service costs.

The Complaint must detail the total amount of damages being sought. This may include, among other things, unpaid rent or utilities which are due and have been demanded, and physical damages to the property. The filing must specify the monthly rent and any security deposit being held. In some instances, the Complaint will indicate that possession of the property is being sought. A landlord seeking to regain possession of a property is required to give the tenant(s) proper notice to quit, unless it is waived in the terms of the lease.

Once filed, a Complaint is to be heard by the Judge within 7-15 days. At this Court, most Recovery of Real Property Hearings are scheduled to occur by Zoom. If an interpreter will be needed, the landlord or tenant must request that one be provided before the date of the Hearing.

Brush Drop Off

1799 Mount Rose Avenue - - 8am—Noon
April—October: 2nd Saturday of the month

Tree limbs are limited to 8 inches in diameter or less and cannot exceed 8 feet in length.

Residents are asked to unload brush from their own vehicles and limit the number of drop offs to 2 truck or trailer loads.

Please prepare your yard waste properly. Yard Waste in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected!

How to Prepare Yard Waste

Place yard waste in biodegradable brown paper bags or bundle it with biodegradable twine in easy-to-handle bundles:

Bundles may be no longer than 5 feet in length.

Bundles may not weigh more than 30 pounds each.

Bundles may not exceed 6 inches in diameter.

Once prepared, yard waste must be placed at the curb on scheduled pick up day before 6:30 am.

An unlimited number of bags or bundles may be placed at the curb.

Grass Clippings



Fruits & Vegetables



Tree Stumps
